As part of this, the San Mateo Library is sponsoring a series of programs which include workshops to learn how to help people who are considering suicide. The workshop "Be Brave, Be Sensitive for Suicide Prevention" will be held at the Sharp Park Library on Monday September 11, 5:30 pm – 7:30 pm.
